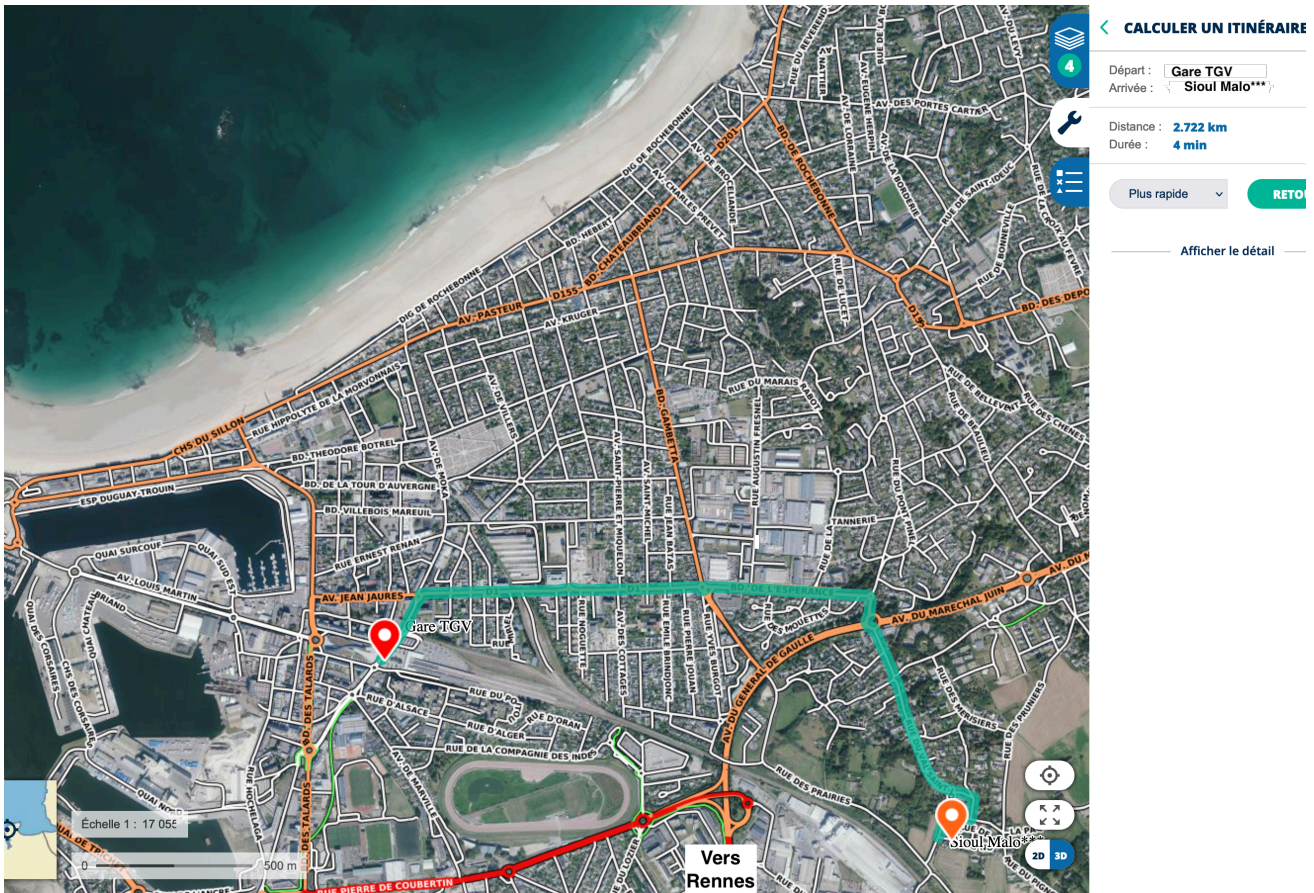

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# How to get to the house



## ITINERARY FROM TRAIN STATION - SIOUL MALO\*\*\*

**Adress of the house:** 53C rue du Val Saint-Joseph 35400 SAINT-MALO

### Access

**By train :** Saint-Malo train station is ideally situated downtown, at a 20 minutes walking distance from Saint-Malo intra-muros. Direct trains from and to Paris in roughly 2 hours. You can also fin local trains (TER) from and to Rennes, less than an hour.

**By car :** Saint-Malo is also very easily accessible by car. Take D168 from the West (Dinard) or D137 from the South (Rennes via highway A11). You can also take one of the many scenic routes from the rest of Bretagne and France.

**By plane :** Rennes airport is served by many airlines and is located 1 hour from Saint-Malo. From there, you can reach « **Sioul Malo\*\*\*** » by car or train. The nearest airport (Dinard Pleurtuit Saint-Malo airport) is at a 15 minutes driving distance.

## Arriving at the house

### Keys

*The arrivals are set between 2pm and 8pm and the departures between 8 and 10 am (except prior agreement).*

## Cleaning

The cleaning and bedding are included in the price.

However :

- A little sweep will be appreciated. No moping necessary.*
- When you leave, the dishes must be clean and tidy, the kitchen cleaned (sink, worktops, hob, splashback) as well as for the outdoor table and for the barbecue (protective cover rested, grids and utensils cleaned and stored) if you have used them.*
- Do not forget to empty the trash can of the house and place the bags in the containers located in the footpath of the garden. The glass must be deposited in one of the many containers available in town.*
- Bed linen and towels are included. When you leave, please collect the folded bed linen (sheets, covers, pillowcases) in the bathroom.*

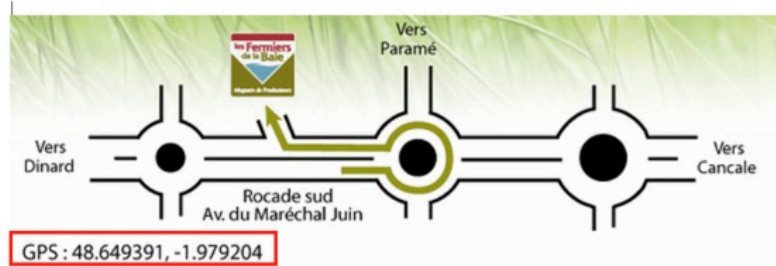

### Sites

#### **Walk on the walkway:**

It is a loop of almost 2 kilometers which is fully accessible to pedestrians and offers superb views of the historic heart and beaches, and the harbor or even Dinard city and the bay of Saint-Malo.

### **Stroll in the port:**

You can choose **to take the sea** to reach Dinard or for maritime excursions in Rance and in the bay of Saint-Malo between cape Fréhel and Chausey islands, to discover the Emerald Coast and why not the Channel Islands... A parenthesis that will leave you with wonderful memories.

### **Saint-Malo beach side:**

- *La Grande Plage du Sillon (the Great Sillon Beach)*... extends its **3 kilometers of white sand** between the Fort National and the tip Rochebonne and runs along almost the entire northwest coast of the city. When the sea recedes, it is immense ! It is the ideal place to relax, practice water sports, swim or take pleasant walks.
- *Bon Secours* beach has the unique appeal of its natural seawater « pool » which fills with water at every tide. There's even a diving board !
- Finally, *Môle* beach to the south of the city is well protected from the winds and offers more intimate setting since it is a little hidden.

### **Discover the historical part of the city:**

- Don't miss a visit to the *Demeure du Corsaire (Mansion of the Pirate)* in the heart of the old town, a passionate-loving guide will brilliantly tell you the story of this private mansion and the town, and bring to life **the era of pirates** and shipowners in times of peace or during war..
- During your walks, you can take a coffee break on the pleasant Place Chateaubriand with its many bars and restaurants, do some shopping on Saint-Vincent street, admire Robert Surcouf's house or contemplate the castle built in the 14th century which now houses the town hall, at the entrance to the fortified town..

### **The great aquarium of Saint-Malo:**

At the great aquarium of Saint-Malo, come and discover marine flora and fauna **like you've never seen before** ! No less than 600 astonishing species await you on 4 000 m2. Dive into the depths with the **simulation of descent into the abyss** aboard the Abyssal Descender. The Nautibus submarine takes you into the depths of a basin with more than 5 000 fishes of hundreds of different species..

### **Around Saint-Malo:**

**Cancale** is a village renowned for its market where you can taste the famous oysters of Cancale, on the spot or to take away. The small market is open every day (7 days a week) in the pretty port of La Houle. Between Cancale and the Pointe du Grouin, you can take the opportunity to take a walk in a **superb setting of steep coast** which is part of the GR34 hike.

**And many other activities: hiking with or without a guide, biking, pleasure of the table with a chef at home, scuba diving, sailing .....**

## **Where to eat and go out**

The old town is overflowing with small shops: ice cream, crepes and other restaurants with local flavors will certainly whet your appetite. Taste Kouign-Amann from Robino bakery, sweet crepes and buckwheat crepes from la Crêperie du Corps de Garde located on Bon Secours beach.

Rue de l'Orme, also called the gourmet street, you will discover very good local products: butters and cheeses from Bordier, Babas from Saint-Malo,

seasonal fruits and vegetables in all 4 seasons, fresh fish from Guinemer fish market.

On the place Chateaubriand you can eat very good seafood at the *Café de l'Ouest*, the best burgers at *Lion d'or*, go for brunch on a Sunday at the *Maison Générale* for the pleasure of the taste buds and the eyes (reservation recommended), and discover the *Cargo Culte* restaurant in a friendly atmosphere, with home cooking and on the menu, pies, salads, sandwiches, soups, in a flea market decor.

In the evening the choice is yours : Celtic atmosphere at St Patrick, or the unmissable La Belle Époque; as for beer lovers, the Aviso will seduce you with its 500 beers !

## Local culture

### Cité Corsaire Festivals:

- The festival « Étonnants Voyageurs » is held every year in Saint-Malo since 1990 for **three days of meetings**, debates, readings, exhibitions and literary cafés across the city... Literature from everywhere is celebrated in this festival open to all audiences of all ages !
- The famous « La Route du Rock » music festival held in winter and summer.
- The month of documentary films
- « Quai des Bulles » the graphic novels and projected image forum...
- The city offers **many events** not to be missed throughout the year !



### **Bretagne specialties tasting:**

Take the opportunity to taste some local specialties and enjoy all the flavors of Bretagne, a renowned gourmet region.

- There's of course wheat crepes and buckwheat crepes, kouign amann, salted caramels, Saint-Malo craquelins which are biscuit rolls served for breakfast or as an aperitif, sausage-wafer, the flagship dish of the markets...
- You can also treat yourself to **seafood and fish**, stars of Bretagne maritime gastronomy: spider crabs, crabs, langoustines, shellfish, the famous *Cancale oysters* mentioned above with both firm and soft flesh...
- In Saint-Malo, it's market day from **Monday to Saturday**, in different parts of the city ! They are as numerous as they are different: local products, crafts, organic market... The intramural market is held on Tuesdays and Fridays with food at the Halle au Blé and seafood products at Place de la Poissonnerie.
